Patchwork of Programs to Help Homeless Veterans


- Federal
 - U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development-VA Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) Program
- State
 - Governor Walz goal to end veteran homelessness
 - Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs Homeless Veterans Registry
- County Veteran Focused Homeless Access Team
- **Local** developments in Twin Cities communities

Federal – U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development-VA Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) Program

- **HUD-VASH** is a collaborative program which pairs HUD's Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) rental assistance with VA case management and supportive services for homeless Veterans.
- Intake & eligibility screening occurs at the VA Community Resource Referral Center (downtown Minneapolis, 1201 Harmon Place, Minneapolis, MN 55403, 612-313-3240)
- Veterans can use a HUD-VASH voucher in their community of choice.
- Like HUD vouchers for the general population, there is flexibility in this resource. Choice is the key word.

- The MDVA Homeless

- There are 136 veterans experiencing homelessness in Hennepin County

Governor Walz Goal to End Veteran Homelessness

2023 Veteran Omnibus Bill included millions in new funding to effectively end and prevent veteran homelessness

- Including funds to construct dozens of permanent supportive housing rental units and facilitate the Homeless Veteran Registry
- Help Minnesota achieve its goal of being the fourth state in the country to declare an end to veteran homelessness statewide.



Hennepin County Homeless to Housing – Veteran Focused Team

- The Homelessness to Housing (H2H) team has several veteran focused caseworkers.
- In two years, Hennepin County has transitioned more than 500 people into permanent housing
- Almost all of them (96%) have stayed in that housing



Veteran Housing in NW Metro – Robin Hotel

- Robbinsdale renovation of existing structure
- 125 year old building at the corner of Hubbard Avenue and 41st Avenue
- Hennepin County purchased the building in 2022 and conveyed it to Minnesota Assistance Council for Veterans (MAC-V)
- Robbinsdale City Council approved the development in September 2023.
- 16 units of affordable housing for homeless veterans planned
- 11 bedrooms and four apartments.
- Intended for both transitional and permanent

affordable housing




Veteran Housing in NW Metro – Plymouth – Valor Place

- Fall 2021 construction, northeast corner of Fernbrook Lane and Rockford Road
- Owned and managed by the Plymouth Housing & Redevelopment Authority (HRA)
- Two-unit rental development for veterans and their families who meet income limits and other eligibility requirements.
