



 Gladstone Crossing - Maplewood

Presenter: Trisha Cummins Kauffman, Executive Director

> Gladstone Crossing will provide 40 units of deeply affordable rental housing at 1375 Frost Avenue in Maplewood, developed by Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative. Approximately 21 units will include permanent supportive housing for young adults aged 18-24 with children, who have experienced homelessness.

Solid Ground will be the service provider for those households, providing case management, parenting education, early learning supports and other services to help break the cycle of homelessness for two generations.



Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity creates new affordable homeownership opportunities in Roseville through a new partnership with the city.

This new model asks Roseville residents who are ready to sell their home to consider selling to Habitat, and with financial support from the city Habitat is able to quickly renovate these homes, maintain existing housing stock, and unlock the transformational power of homeownership for low-to-moderate income homebuyers in the Metro area.







Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity Impact & Mission





City of Roseville identified affordable housing as a major priority WHY

• TCHFH identified as a strong partner with aligned mission and ability to deliver

WHAT

- Partnership to acquire 1-4 single family and townhomes per year
- Complete improvements
- Sell to a family at/below 80% AMI using a land trust model to allow for greater and more long-term affordability



Land Trust Model

- Affordability mechanism that allows us to bring additional subsidy under the land
- The land trust holds the land in a trust, and the structure or the home is owned by the buyer
- A ground lease is executed between the land trust and the buyer
- The homeowner owns the home
- On future sales, there is an equity sharing equation with the homeowner and the land trust



HOW \$\$\$

- Significant financial commitment from City of Roseville/REDA
- Up to \$80,000/unit, grant
 - CDBG funds
 - Affordable Housing TIF
 - ARPA funds
- Joint partnership in applying for/bringing in additional funding sources
 - Ramsey County
 - Met Council
 - MHFA



Started our search on the MLS

• Direct mailer to approximately 900 residents

WHEN

HOW

- The partnership program guidelines were adopted/master agreement authorized in November 2021
- To date, we've acquired (12) existing properties and (1) vacant property where we will build a twinhome







HORIZO

- Future of the Roseville Partnership program
- Expansion into other communities
- Metro county sales tax
- 4d property tax classification



The project is currently studying how the White Bear Avenue route would stack up against a Bruce Vento Corridor route.

The numbers and plans for the new route will be sent to the federal government to get the federal funding. The project will be funded 50% by Ramsey County and 50% by the Federal Transit Authority.

The Purple Line impacts housing, small businesses, and could be a major driver for increased investment in the East Side of St. Paul and the East Metro.


